Abstract

This collection documents John Hordines' career as a physical educator, wrestling coach, and sportswriter. The collection includes materials from Hordines' undergraduate education at Syracuse University in 1930, his early career as a physical education teacher, his later career teaching at the New York Institute for the Education of the Blind and his attempt to create an agricultural education center for the blind in the early 1970s. Hordines' writings in this collection include his academic studies of physical education curriculums and his journalism work covering the world of amateur wrestling in the mid-twentieth century.

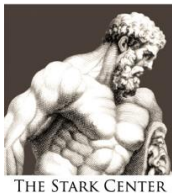

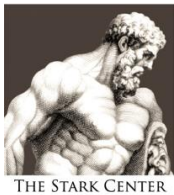

BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION

John Hordines was born on October 1, 1908 in Pohar, Austria to Lucas and Julia Polovkowitz. At the age of three, he immigrated to the United States. He played football and wrestled for Mt. Carmel High School in Pennsylvania, accruing attention in local media for his football talent.

After graduating from Mt. Carmel High School in 1930, Hordines attended Syracuse University. At Syracuse he majored in Physical Education. He played on the football, wrestling, soccer, and rugby teams at Syracuse and contributed to the *Keylock Society*, a student wrestling publication at Syracuse.

Hordines began to further pursue an interest in amateur athletics after his graduation from Syracuse in 1934. He began work in the Health Department of the Young Men's Christian Association branch in Troy, New York. He spearheaded the Adirondack branch of the Amateur Athletic Union in 1938. He also helped organize the *America's Finest Physique Contest* in 1938 and 1939. Subsequently, he taught physical education and coached wrestling and football at the Valley Forge Military Academy, University of Connecticut, and Sampson College through the 1940s.

Happening concurrently with his teaching in the late 1940s and early 1950s was Hordines' work as the amateur wrestling correspondent for *The Body Builder* magazine. His column, *Wrestling World*, provided readers with the highlights from the world of amateur wrestling. At *The Body Builder*, Hordines also helped organize the All-American Wrestling Team for amateur wrestlers and attempted to create an International Sports Shrine in upstate New York.

In 1950, Hordines began work as a physical education teacher at the New York Institute for the Education of the Blind (NYIEB). At the NYIEB, Hordines led a Boy Scout troop, coached wrestling, and started a crew team for the blind students at the school. Working at the NYIEB kickstarted Hordines' passion for instructing disabled people in athletics and physical. After leaving the NYIEB in 1955, Hordines worked as the Director of Activities for the Edenwald School in the Bronx, coaching wrestling and football. From 1957 to 1961, Hordines taught shop at the Brooklyn Friends School. In 1961, he left the Brooklyn Friends School to work as a substitute

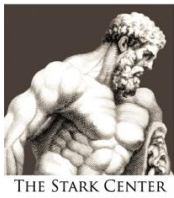

teacher for the Mt. Vernon school district in New York and coach football and wrestling at Trinity School. In 1961, Hordines unsuccessfully attempted to obtain his New York teacher's license.

After marrying his second wife, Ida van Dyck, in 1966, Hordines became further involved in the Presbyterian church, developing organizations and retreats. In collaboration with other Presbyterian churches, Hordines unsuccessfully attempted to launch the Harvard Agricultural and Rural Group for the Blind (HARGB). The HARGB would have bought acres of farmland in New England to teach agricultural skills to blind students. After the unsuccessful attempt to launch the HARGB, Hordines became further involved in assisting with the day-to-day functions of his wife's congregation, the Fort Schuyler Presbyterian Church. He also developed an interest in gardening later in life. Hordines passed away on September 22, 2004.



SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection contains correspondence with other amateur wrestling enthusiasts and athletes, academic and professional writing, teaching materials (lesson plans and blank exams), athletic materials (promotional, educational, and awards), photographs, and newspaper clippings from 1921 to 1976, the bulk of the materials originating from the late-1940s to mid-1950s. The photographs are all within sleeves in the order they were presented in the original folders and newspaper clippings have been duplicated. The material primarily concerns Hordines' professional life as an educator, coach, and journalist. There are few materials pertaining to Hordines' personal life.

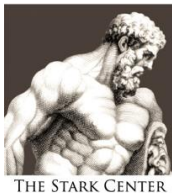
Series 1: Syracuse University, 1930-1934 offers glimpses into Hordines' undergraduate life, especially his involvement with the campus wrestling organization The Keylock Society, and his academic writing. Series 2: Early career, 1934-1950 covers his professional life before employment at The New York Institute for the Education of the Blind, including job applications, letters of recommendation, and materials related to the various amateur sports organizations that he founded during that 16-year period. His largest collection of professional materials from that period, including correspondence, teaching materials, and newspaper clippings, is contained in Series 3: Valley Forge Military Academy, 1943-1944.

Series 4: The New York Institute for the Blind, 1950-1955 covers the five years that Hordines spent as a physical education teacher, wrestling coach, and rowing instructor at the New York Institute for the Education of the Blind. Along with teaching materials and rewards from his athletic endeavors, the series contains print and photograph materials related to a Boy Scout troop he led at the school and writings on disabled people and sports from that period.

Series 5: *Wrestling World* column, 1948-1952 covers Hordines' time spent as a journalist covering amateur wrestling for *The Body Builder* magazine. The collection contains correspondence from fans, friends, and journalistic sources related to his work for *Wrestling World*, various other research materials, and typed copies of Hordines' *Wrestling World* columns. It also includes materials related to Hordines' endeavors as a representative of *The Body Builder* magazine, including the annual All-American Wrestling Team and the International Sports Shrine.

Series 6: Later career, 1955-1962 covers the tail end of Hordines' teaching career, including correspondence related to obtaining his teaching license, job applications, and materials for his classes at various New York City schools. Series 7: The Harvard Agricultural and Rural Group for the Blind, 1955-1971, showcases correspondence, organization materials, and newspaper clippings that highlight Hordines' activism in support of professional training for blind people after leaving the New York Institute for the Education of the Blind.

Series 8: Personal Papers, 1921-1976 showcase Hordines' own passion for athletics, his commitment to faith, and his activism for disabled people through personal correspondence, newspaper clippings, and photographs. Also included in this series is his extensive pamphlet collection.
