



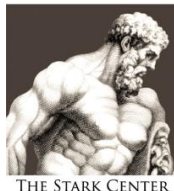

Abstract

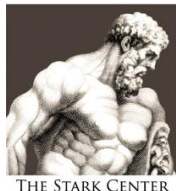
The Littlefield Collection documents the lives and careers of Coach Clyde Littlefield, an athlete, coach, and administrator at the University of Texas at Austin, and his son, Clyde Rabb Littlefield, a military historian. The collection includes a wide range of materials such as personal papers, photographs, letters, memorabilia, and official university documents that reflect the athletic and professional achievements of Clyde Littlefield as well as family life. The collection also features photographs, writings, and personal papers of Clyde Rabb Littlefield, offering insight into his academic contributions and connection to the university.

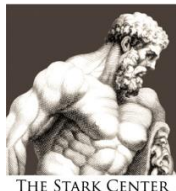

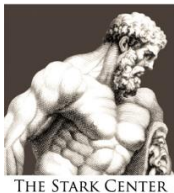
BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION

Clyde Littlefield was born on October 6, 1892, in Oil City, Pennsylvania, to John Wesley and Mable Littlefield. In 1904, after his mother passed away, he moved with his father and sister, Grace, to Spindletop, Texas, where his father was drawn by the Spindletop oil boom. Littlefield attended various schools, including Peacock Military Academy in San Antonio and Marshall Training School, where he distinguished himself as a talented athlete, becoming a state champion in the hurdles.

In 1912, Littlefield entered UT and earned 12 letters in three sports, football, basketball, and track, over the next four years. Littlefield played on three undefeated football teams, helped popularize the forward pass in college football, and led the 1914 football team to an undefeated season. He was also a high-point man in basketball, earning All-American honors, and was a member of the Kappa Alpha Order and Sigma Delta Psi. He graduated from UT in 1916.

During World War I, Littlefield completed basic training and duty as first sergeant at Camp Mabry in Austin, Texas. He was then transferred to officers' school at Camp Pike in Little Rock, Arkansas. Following his military service, Littlefield began his coaching career at Greenville High School in Greenville, Texas, where he coached football, basketball, and track.

In 1920, Littlefield was hired as head track and field coach and freshman football and basketball coach at UT. He became head football coach in 1927 and served until 1933, during which time he led the Longhorns to two Southwest Conference championships. He stepped down as head football coach to focus exclusively on track and field, where he enjoyed continued success. Littlefield married Henrietta Rabb of Lone Oak, Texas, who he met while working at Greenville High School, on June 20, 1922. They had one son, Clyde Rabb Littlefield, born in 1931.

Littlefield cofounded the Texas Relays, a multi-day track and field meet, in 1925 with Athletic Director L. Theo Bellmont. The Clyde Littlefield Texas Relays, as the event was renamed in 1963, is internationally known and has hosted many Olympic athletes. In 2025 the Texas Relays was awarded the World Athletics Heritage Plaque in the category of “Competition” by the Museum of World Athletics (MOWA).

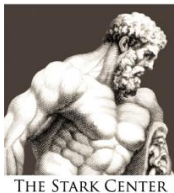
Littlefield’s coaching career spanned 41 years, and during this time, he mentored athletes who went on to achieve national and international recognition, including Olympians and National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) champions. His influence was also felt in his administrative roles, as he served as president of the NCAA Track Coaches Association and was a long-time member of the NCAA track and field rules committee. He was also a member of the coaching staff for the 1952 U.S. Olympic team in Helsinki. Texas Governor John Connally honored Littlefield’s achievement by declaring April 2, 1963, “Clyde Littlefield Day.”

Clyde Littlefield died on May 20, 1981, at 88 years old. He is recognized in the Helms Foundation Hall of Fame, the Texas Sports Hall of Fame, the UT Athletics Hall of Honor, and the National Track and Field Hall of Fame.

Clyde Rabb Littlefield was born in Austin, Texas, on March 10, 1931, to Clyde and Henrietta Littlefield. He attended Austin's public schools and graduated from UT in 1953 with a Bachelor of Arts in Government, followed by a Master of Arts in History in 1958. He was an active member of the United States Air Force ROTC while at UT, and after earning his bachelor’s, he was commissioned as a second lieutenant and served as a unit historian. His military service also included assignments in Japan, where he worked as a command historian at Tachikawa, Japan, after the Korean War had ended.

In the early 1980s, Littlefield retired from the Air Force and returned to Austin, where he transitioned to a career in real estate investment and property management. He became an influential figure in the Austin real estate community, restoring significant historical properties such as the Robinson-Rosner Building on Congress Avenue. Littlefield dedicated much of his spare time to researching the early history of the university and its prominent figures, a project that eventually led to the publication of a book in 2008 about the origins of the Kappa Alpha Order at UT, the fraternity that both he and his father had been a part of. The book was titled *First Meeting West of the Mississippi: Kappa Alpha Order*.

Throughout his life, Clyde Rabb Littlefield was deeply committed to preserving the history of The University of Texas and his father’s legacy. Gifts of his estate support ongoing research and archival work at The University of Texas. His various estate gifts include an endowed archivist position for The University of Texas Archives and Texas History Collection at the Dolph Briscoe

Center for American History, the Clyde Rabb Littlefield Chair in Texas History, the Coach Clyde Littlefield Endowed Excellence Fund for Texas Track, Clyde Littlefield Head Coach Endowment for Track and Field, and the Clyde Rabb Littlefield Dean's Chair in Liberal Arts. He also provided gifts to the Stark Center to support the Coach Clyde Littlefield Archives Room and the annual Clyde Rabb Littlefield lecture series.

Clyde Rabb Littlefield passed away March 7, 2018. He was preceded in death by his parents; his wife, Mildred Alice Hovey, a native of Baton Rouge, Louisiana; and their infant daughter, Lillian.

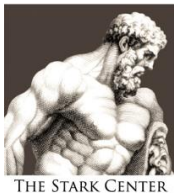

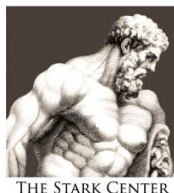
SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Littlefield collection spans from 1881 to 2018 and contains nine series that document the life, legacy, and achievements of Clyde Littlefield and his son, Clyde Rabb Littlefield.

Series 1, **Awards and memorabilia** (1912–2012, undated), showcases Clyde Littlefield's distinguished career in athletics, including includes Clyde Littlefield's medals, plaques, and honors from the United States Olympic Committee and NCAA. Series 2, **Littlefield family papers** (1928-1996, undated), captures family life and financial records. Series 3, **Personal papers** (1927-2018, undated), contains writings, family correspondence, and research materials from both Littlefield's. Series 4, **Correspondence** (1926-2014, undated), features both personal and professional communications, including letters with family, friends, and institutions like The University of Texas at Austin. Series 5, **Research and writings** (1881-2017, undated), includes extensive research conducted by Clyde Rabb on athletics, genealogy, and The University of Texas. Series 6, **Sports and coaching materials** (1893–2017, undated), includes athletic programs, coaching guides, and Olympic records, highlighting both Littlefield's' contributions to athletics. Series 7, **Religious, fraternal, and community materials** (1902–2014, undated), documents the family's involvement with the Kappa Alpha Order and community organizations. Series 8, **Photographs and scrapbooks** (1908–1974, undated), documents family, athletic milestones, real estate projects, and media coverage of Clyde Littlefield's career. Lastly, Series 9, **Newspapers** (1930-2018, undated), includes full local newspapers and clippings concerning The University of Texas at Austin.

Clyde Littlefield's achievements are prominently represented, particularly his foundational role in college athletics and his lasting impact on track and field. His athletic and coaching career at The University of Texas at Austin, including his leadership of the Texas Longhorns and his pivotal role in co-founding the Texas Relays, is thoroughly documented. Items such as awards, certificates, news coverage, and scrapbooks reflect his national recognition and enduring influence. His work with the 1952 U.S. Olympic Team and involvement in national athletics organizations further underscore his legacy as a builder of American sport.

Clyde Rabb's role as a military historian, educator, and real estate preservationist shaped much of the collection scope. His interest in the history of the university is represented through extensive research files, notes, and manuscripts. The real estate documents in the collection capture his efforts to preserve and restore historic Austin properties, particularly the Robinson-Rosner Building on Congress Avenue. His estate gifts, which led to the establishment of endowed positions and research funds at UT, demonstrate a remarkable dedication to memory, education, and institutional history.



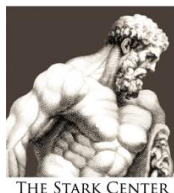

While the collection is robust in its documentation of both Clyde Littlefield's and Clyde Rabb Littlefield's lives, there are a few gaps. One significant omission is the limited presence of coaching materials that reflect Clyde Littlefield's training strategies, athletic philosophies, or methods. Similarly, although both father and son served in the military, the collection offers only surface-level documentation of these experiences. Lastly, while the collection includes some scrapbooks from Henrietta Littlefield and a selection of family photos, there is a notable absence of detailed documentation about the women in the Littlefield family, including Clyde Rabb's wife and daughter. Researchers should also be advised that in some instances it may be unclear if materials came from the father, Clyde Littlefield, or the son, Clyde Rabb Littlefield.
